his month Nome celebrated the 100th Anniversary of the Serum Run, when a dog team relay brought



the necessary medicine to Nome to combat a diphtheria outbreak. The weeklong celebration included

historical talks and films at the museum, and a group of dog mushers reenacted the delivery of the serum by running the final leg of the trail from Safety to Nome. Leonard Seppala, the fastest musher on the Seward Peninsula at the time, ran the longest distance through the most challenging terrain and weather with his dog Togo in the lead. He retired to Maine, and started a dog kennel there. To commemorate this centennial, a musher from Maine who has dogs descended from that kennel traveled the complete route of the relay.

Promoting events like this through live interviews with some of the organizers and encouraging participation is yet another way KICY interacts with our community.

n Western Alaska, basketball is played, watched, and enjoyed by all ages. Every small high school in the region usually has enough students to field a team. In Nome, City League basketball happens each winter with teams made up of both recent graduates and those who have been out of school for decades. The Lonnie O'Connor Basketball Classic during Iditarod Week brings adult teams from the villages in the Norton Sound region to Nome for a week of

intense play, a packed Recreation Center gym, and bragging rights. High school teams travel by air to various schools to participate in tournaments and league games.

Since the very beginning, KICY has broadcast high school basketball. Teams have to travel great distances to play other schools and it is not always possible for family and friends to attend the games. Radio fills that gap. Throughout the years, many have honed their play-by-play announcing skills on KICY. At times there has been one key announcer who takes most, if not all the home games. For away games, KICY partners with other local radio stations to air their coverage. We reciprocate when those teams visit Nome. This year, Nome will be hosting three major tournaments with multiple teams visiting. It is nearly physically impossible for one person to call an entire tournament without losing their voice so this year we have gathered a team of people to call the games. A few of the pairings are pictured on the next page. Covenant pastors, our Conference Superintendent, a college student, and a few high school students have stepped up, and for some, out of their comfort zones, to lend their voices to our live broadcasts.




