This year was filled with ups and downs, moments of great joy and moments of deep sadness, times of

frenetic work and times of rest. I would imagine your year was much the same. Yet in the midst of it all, God is still working out His purposes both at KICY and in the lives of His followers. To God be the glory.

There were a couple of significant goodbyes this year. Stuart Joseph completed his year of service with us and returned to California in June where he is seeking God's next step for his life. We have yet to find a full-time staff member to take on his responsibilities. In a loss that is deeply felt on multiple levels, Terry Reynolds was welcomed into the arms of Jesus in January. Four people are now on the "engineering quick call" list, filling the role Terry played for many years as our go-to engineer. I am grateful for Terry's legacy and the willingness of so many to help KICY with our engineering needs in his absence.

Those were a couple lows, but there were equally as many, if not more, highs. We have begun plans for a major renovation of the studio building and God has once again moved a project forward faster than expected. He has provided engineers and architects to complete an initial assessment, funding from unexpected sources, and churches that are already putting together teams to help construct a staff triplex next summer. Most of the money is in the bank for the first phase of this project, thanks to the power cost savings we have realized since we replaced our transmitter four years ago, a generous grant from the Covenant Foundation, and as unlikely as it seems, political advertising. As a commercial radio station we have to air political ads and this year saw a contested race for the US House and a ballot measure that produced more revenue for KICY than in any political season in the past. And God can use even that for His glory!

We are in communication with a company that is putting together the design of a staff triplex. Once those plans are approved the panels will be manufactured and hopefully be in Nome on the first barge of the summer. While we have funds on hand for this phase, it is just the tip of the iceberg for the renovations needed. Phase 2 of this project is the studio. The foundation needs significant reinforcement and the roof needs to be completely replaced. Those are major expenses. We will also be reconfiguring the interior of the studio to better serve our broadcasting needs. Would you prayerfully consider making a gift of any amount at this year's end? We are confident God will provide the funds to complete this project, and the needed staff members. Why? Because He has done so in the past and is faithful.


